

Sunday Morning Operational Plan - Updated August 3rd, 2021

The following plan summarizes the procedures for Cornerstone Church's Sunday Morning Services.

General Operational Procedures:

| Communications | Cornerstone will make the Sunday Morning Operational Plan available on the website to all members, regular attenders, and visitors. |

| Food | Water only, please. No outside food or beverage. |
| Custodial | Cornerstone will plan to use air filters (some with Carbon, True HEPA, and UV filters). The Lodge Conference custodial staff is responsible for cleaning both rooms as well as the restrooms. |
| Hygiene and Sanitation | Hand Sanitizer will be available. |
| Fever or Symptoms | If anyone attending Cornerstone, or anyone in their household, has had a fever over 100.4, an unexplained cough, or shortness of breath within the last 24 hours, it is requested that they refrain from attending services. |
