II. ELEMENTS OF INGRATITUDE

Our lack of thankfulness is rooted in our sinful flesh (Romans 7), specifically in these elements:

A. Unbelief

Heb 3:12 Beware, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God...

B. Pride

Rom 12:3 ...I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think...

C. Selfishness

James 1:14-15

But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire.

Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin...

James 4:1-3 Where do wars and fights [come] from among you? Do [they] not [come] from your [desires for] pleasure that war in your members? You lust and do not have....

D. Idolatry

Col. 3:5 Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is IDOLATRY.

III. EXHORTATIONS TO GRATITUDE

Psa. 107:1-2	Oh give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His lovingkindness is everlasting. Let the redeemed of the Lord say so
Phil. 4:6	Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.
Col. 2:7	having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed and overflowing with gratitude
1 Thess. 5:18	in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
Heb. 13:15	Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name.
Eph 5:4	and there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks.

*EXAMINE YOUR HEART: Are you a grumbler and complainer? Or a truster and a thanker? Remember what you deserve – and the grace you've been given instead. Begin and end your day with thanksgiving and intentionally remind your heart of all you have to be grateful for.

THREE KEYS TO ENDURING FAITHFULLY

I. CONFIDENT HOPE (v. 12a)

Biblical hope is totally different from the world's hope. God's hope is something that is *certain* but not yet *realized*. It is based on His character and His promises and therefore we can trust it. Our hope is not based on what we can see, but on the eternal things which are unseen.

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Ps. 39:7

And now O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in You.

Rom. 8:23-25 For we are saved by hope...

Romans 15:13-14 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that in

the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

Heb. 6:19 This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, a [hope] both sure and

steadfast...

III. DILIGENT PRAYER (v. 12c)

If we are to endure, we must be diligent in prayer. The encouragement and comfort we receive in prayer is what makes our endurance possible.

- Set aside time to pray
- Consider developing a prayer-partner relationship
- Choose models and study their content, their humility, their boldness, their passion
- Develop a system for your prayer lists
- Adopt practical ways to keep your mind focused
- In your prayers, mingle praise, confession, and intercession; but when you intercede, think through, in light of scripture, what it is that God wants us to ask for

John Bunyan:

You can do more than pray, after you have prayed, But you cannot do more than pray, <u>until</u> you have prayed.

S.D. Gordon:

The greatest thing anyone can do for God and for man is to <u>pray</u>. It is not the only thing. But it is the chief thing.

CONCLUSION

As we faithfully endure in the midst of suffering, we <u>must</u> understand the importance of the *indicative* and the *imperative*:

The Indicative: who we are in Christ - our POSITION (Eph. 1-3)

The Imperative: what we are commanded to do - our PRACTICE (Eph. 4-6)

Indicative without the imperative = disobedience, laziness

Imperative without the indicative = legalism

NOT I BUT CHRIST

(Author Unknown)

The following are some of the features and manifestations of the self-life. The Holy Spirit alone can interpret and apply this to your individual case. As you read, examine yourself in the very presence of God. Are you ever conscious of:

- A secret spirit of pride an exalted feeling, in view of your success or position; because of your good training or appearance; because of your natural gifts and abilities? An important, independent spirit?
- Love of human praise a secret fondness to be noticed; love of supremacy; drawing attention to self in conversation; a swelling out of self when you have had a free time in speaking or praying?
- The stirrings of anger or impatience which worst of all, you call nervousness or holy indignation; a touchy, sensitive spirit; a disposition to resent or retaliate when disapproved of or contradicted; a desire to throw sharp, heated flings at another?
- Self-will a stubborn, unteachable spirit; an arguing, talkative spirit; harsh, sarcastic expressions; an unyielding, head- strong disposition; a driving, commanding spirit; a disposition to criticize and pick flaws when set aside and unnoticed; a peevish, fretful spirit; a disposition that loves to be coaxed and humored?
- Carnal fear a man-fearing spirit; a shrinking from reproach and duty; reasoning around your cross; a shrinking from doing your whole duty by those of wealth or position; a fearfulness that someone will offend and drive some prominent person away; a compromising spirit?
- A jealous disposition a secret spirit of envy shut up in your heart; an unpleasant sensation in view of the prosperity and success of another; a disposition to speak of the faults and failings, rather than the gifts and virtues of those more talented and appreciated than yourself?
- A dishonest, deceitful disposition the evading and covering of the truth; the covering up of your real faults; leaving a better impression of yourself than is strictly true; false humility; exaggeration; straining the truth?

Unbelief – a spirit of discouragement in times of pressure and opposition; lack of quietness and confidence in God; lack of faith and trust in God; a disposition to worry and complain in the midst of pain, poverty, or at the dispensations of divine providence; an overanxious feeling whether everything will come out all right?

Formality and deadness – lack of concern for lost souls; dryness and indifference; lack of power with God?

Selfishness — love of ease, love of money?

These are some of the traits that generally indicate a heart focused on self. By prayer, hold your heart open to the searchlight of God, until you see the groundwork thereof. "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my thoughts: and see if there be any wicked way in me." (Psalm 139:23,24)

The Holy Spirit will enable you, by confession and faith, to bring your "self-life" to the death. Do not patch over, but go to the bottom. It alone will pay.

- Eph. 1:15-19 Therefore I ... do not cease to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers: that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe according to the working of His mighty power...
- Eph. 3:14-19 For this reason I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, from whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.
- Phil. 1:9-11 And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in knowledge and all discernment, that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ, being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.
- Col. 1:9-12 For this reason we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you and to ask that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy; giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light.

A strong desire to know God and glorify Him

A strong desire for Bible study and scripture memorization

CHARACTER QUALITIES (for all loved ones)

Fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control Unselfishness, sacrificial love, and forgiveness toward others (<u>especially</u> toward other family members)

A love for honesty and truth (and a hatred for lying!)

Humility and a grateful spirit

Holiness/godliness in daily living

Wisdom/seeking God's guidance in decisions

That they would conquer their personal areas of weakness (list them) (Ex: pride, selfishness, anger, etc.)

Special requests for husbands

Purity and faithfulness (mental, emotional, physical)

Leadership in the family (family worship, setting standards, etc.)

Wisdom in decision-making

I Tim 3:2-7 (above reproach, husband of one wife, temperate, sober-minded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach, not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous, one who rules his own house well, having his children in submission with all reverence, not a novice, having a good reputation among those who are outside the church)

Special requests for children

Love and respect for parents/a submissive, obedient, teachable spirit

Courage to stand against peer pressure and temptation (not be controlled by "fear of man")

Moral purity/physical purity till marriage (daughters especially: concern for modest dress)

That they would someday be a godly wife or godly husband

Pray for future spouse (genuinely converted, live a godly life, be obedient to the Word)

Physical protection for children

Remember this is YOUR notebook – feel free to personalize it any way you want! These are just some suggestions for how you might want to organize it.

For each person you plan to pray for regularly: Make an insertable tab divider with their name on it. Fill out a "title page" for them with starting date, scripture references, and a list of long-term prayer requests on it. Place the title page after the tab divider and follow this with white paper for your daily entries. Then put the set of pages behind an appropriate prayer category divider (family, friends, church, etc.). Pray systematically through your list, just one request at a time, and you should be able to pray through it several times in a year. At times, you may need to depart from the list in order to pray about current concerns and situations, but when there is no pressing issue at the moment, go back to your list.

To make prayer category dividers and title pages: It is better to make these out of colored stock paper or tab dividers instead of white paper (so they will be more easily seen.)

Questions for Group Discussion

Session 1 Discussion Questions (Called to be Thankful):

•	As Pam outlined for us, our lack of thankfulness is rooted in our sinful flesh - specifically in unbelief, pride, selfishness, a	and
	dolatry. Explain how each of these things leads to unthankfulness. How have you seen this to be true in your own life?	

- In what ways are you tempted towards grumbling and complaining? How can you practically be putting off ungrateful thoughts, words, and actions, be renewed in your mind to have a thankful heart, and put on thoughts, words, and actions that are thankful to God?
- What are some things (God's character, promises, actions towards you, His grace in your life, etc.) that you can thank the Lord for this week?

Session 2 Discussion Questions (Called to Endure):

- In who or what are you commonly tempted to set your hope? How does setting your hope on Christ differ from setting your hope on external/circumstantial things? What is the outcome of both? Why then are we so easily tempted and give in to placing our hope on something other than Christ?
- Why is prayer so key to our endurance in trials and suffering?
- Scripture outlines many benefits to trials. Which might you need to remind yourself of during difficulty? (See Deut. 8:2, 16; Rom 5:3-4; James 1:2-4; Phil 3:10; 1 Pet 1:6-7, 5:10; 2 Cor 1:4-5, 4:17 from the notes)
- Explain the difference between the Indicative (who we are in Christ) and the imperative (what we are commanded to do). Why is it vital to emphasize both of these?

Session 3 Discussion Questions (Called to Pray):

- In what areas of your life do you need to grow in bringing your cares to the Lord, as explained in Philippians 4:6-7? What specifically do you need to pray about?
- Why should we pray? (See points I, II, and III from the outline) Why do you think we so often struggle to pray as we should? What lies are we believing, sin are we holding on to, or what wrong things are we loving when we don't pray as we should?
- When do you regularly pray to the Lord? Are you even doing so? How much time are you devoting to bringing your cares and concerns to God? How might you need to adjust, if anything, your daily prayers?
- When you pray are you merely asking God for things, or are you also praising God and thanking him for who he is and how he has blessed you?
