**Entrust** Why a Literal Adam Who Literally Sinned? 2024

## Thesis: A literal salvation requires a literal Adam in Genesis 1-3.

1) The NT assumes a literal Adam (cf. Mark 10, Rom 5, 1 Cor 15)

Romans 5:12–19 Therefore, just as <u>through one man sin entered into the world</u>, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned – <sup>13</sup> for until the Law sin was in the world, but sin is not imputed when there is no law. <sup>14</sup> Nevertheless death reigned <u>from Adam</u> until Moses, even over those who had not sinned in the likeness of <u>the offense of Adam</u>, who is a type of Him who was to come. <sup>15</sup> But the free gift is not like the transgression. For if <u>by the</u> transgression of the one the many died, much more did the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abound to the many. <sup>16</sup> The gift is not like *that which came* <u>through</u> <u>the one who sinned</u>; for on the one hand the judgment *arose* from one *transgression* resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the free gift *arose* from many transgressions resulting in justification. <sup>17</sup> For if by <u>the transgression of the one</u>, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup> So then as <u>through one transgression</u> there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men. <sup>19</sup> For as <u>through the one man's disobedience</u> the many were made sinners, even so through the obedience of the One the many will be made righteous.

1 Corinthians 15:21–22 For since <u>by a man *came* death</u>, by a man also *came* the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup> For as <u>in Adam all die</u>, so also in Christ all will be made alive.

2) A literal Adam is essential for a literal salvation, justification, & eternal life

To reject a literal understanding of Gensis 1-3, along with a literal Adam and Eve (who sinned), is to reject the following:

- 1. The existence of sin and death.
- 2. A literal Jesus who died on the cross and rose from the dead.
- 3. The reality of justification, salvation, & heaven.
